Parent/Guardian Information

Please read the following information carefully. Should you have any questions or concerns please e-mail us or call us.

Flight Information: Kodiak Airport is accessed primarily through Anchorage International Airport utilizing Alaska Airlines or ERA Aviation. All major airlines utilize Anchorage International Airport and connections are easily made throughout the continental U.S. It is advisable to book flights promptly as Alaska is a major destination for tourists during the summer. Students will be picked up at Kodiak Airport upon arrival and delivered to Kodiak Airport for departure by Kodiak Pathways. All transportation will be performed by senior staff personnel. Please complete and return the "Student Itinerary Sheet" once you have been notified your son or daughter has been accepted and the flight plans have been finalized. *Upon receipt of the Student Itinerary Sheet, Kodiak Pathways will provide you with an emergency assistance phone number for your son or daughter to use once they get to Anchorage in the event of a missed or canceled flight from Anchorage into Kodiak.*

What to Bring: Kodiak Island's weather during the summer months can vary in temperature from the 70's to the 40's. Conditions at times can be windy and rainy. Therefore, it is important to prepare for unpredictable weather. The following list should assist you with ensuring that your son or daughter will be comfortable regardless of weather conditions.

Rain jacket and pants (good quality, i.e. Helly Hansen)	1 set

Fishing Gear

Hip boots, waist or chest waders. (Hip boots are sufficient and are much easier to pack and are less expensive)

Fishing vest (a basic vest can be purchased for under \$30)

Fishing rods, reels, lures, flies, and all other tackle will be provided. However, if your child wishes to bring his /her own, a 7wt, 9ft, fly rod with a weight fwd, fast sinking tip line is recommended.

Polarized sun glasses

Accessories

Sleeping bag (+20 temp rating minimum) and ground pad

Toiletries/personal hygiene products

Wash cloth (2); Bath towel (2)

Prescribed medications (will be collected by senior staff for administration)

Flashlight or headlamp (extra batteries)

Camera (film if not digital, batteries)

Writing journal

Day pack (sufficient to hold rain gear, camera, water bottle)

“Nalgene” type water bottle.

*****Laptop computers, hand held video games, calculators, and cell phones are acceptable during travel, however such items will be collected and secured when your student reaches the lodge for security and aesthetic reasons.**

******Each student will be required to contact his or her parent/guardian upon arrival in Kodiak in the presence of a senior staff counselor.**
